A Resolution – With a Difference

Making New Year resolutions has always been easy – but following through for most of us is difficult. Many last, at best, a week with most having been abandoned by the end of January.

They may include things like losing weight, exercising regularly, spending more time with the kids or watching less TV.

Why do most of us fail to follow through? We have good intentions. We know they are beneficial. The simple answer is human nature! We just don't have the willpower. The desire is there but the 'wherewithal' isn't. To use biblical language, "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

I wonder whether the Apostle Paul was sitting early one morning – maybe at the start of a year - reflecting on what he wanted most in life: what would be his key 'resolution' - his greatest desire. We get a hint in the first part of Philippians 3. In writing to the church in Philippi, he is reflecting on his past life as a zealous, law-keeping Pharisee and how he came to recognize that, in his encounter with lesus on the Damascus Road, his old life was now "a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus (his) Lord"; in fact, he regarded it as "garbage" by comparison!

But that experience was not enough. It was just the beginning. He was to go on to declare in verse 10, "I want to know Christ!"

But, Paul, you have just stated you do know him. Now you are stating you want to know him! What are you saying? He knew the difference between

knowing someone, in the sense of being acquainted with them, and knowing them in an intimate relationship as, for example, as a husband and wife know each other.

Paul was a serious Christian. He longed to please God, be a godly man and he was passionate about evangelism. What motivated these? It was his overwhelming desire – his resolution - to "know Christ". His priority in life was to cultivate his relationship with Jesus. Everything else was secondary.

Should not this be our new year's resolution? An essential thing to help make this possible would be determining to spend more time in prayer. This is key. Not just 'praying' but in prayer. Deliberately putting aside time to do so, in a disciplined way.

A comment by **Philip Yancey** in answer to a common question recently caught my attention: What good does it do to pray if God already knows everything? He responded that "Jesus silences such questions: he prayed, and so should we." If Jesus, despite his eternal relationship with his Father, would spend so much time while on earth in prayer, how much more do we need to.

That is the bottom line. In addition, determine to join others in prayer. Go to the church prayer meetings.

Further, be more committed to reading and meditating on Scripture. There is no replacement for a regular 'quiet time.' In addition, join with others to study Scripture. Make a commitment to be part of a home group and determine that the Bible study will be your priority that evening - other commitments and demands will be secondary.

A new opportunity to get to know Christ and our faith better is being offered before Sunday service each week with a short Bible study. Come out a little earlier in the morning and be a part of that. I mentioned earlier that most of us are not good at following through on our resolutions because "the flesh is weak." However, as Christians we have a promise from God that "our strength is made perfect in weakness." In context, it means that if we are serious about knowing Christ better, and we ask his Holy Spirit to help us and to keep us faithful in our endeavour, he will give us the strength - the commitment - to stay on track. He will help us to follow through on our resolution.
