Zooming In or Zooming Out?

I recently read an article which caught my attention. It was a blog I receive daily from the Colson Center for Christian Worldview and was written by its director **John Stonestreet** with **Shane Morris**, and it was highlighting something that has been increasingly concerning me. It was the title which first got my attention: 'Why So Many Are Choosing Couches Over Pews.'

The article covered a number of issues but the essential one it addressed was that, following the recent pandemic, a large number of people have not returned to in-person church services, with many of these listening by way of streaming or YouTube.

We live in a new, technological world. One modern invention for which many were indebted during the recent pandemic was Zoom, and churches and Christian ministries quickly realised how important it was when people could not meet physically. It still has many excellent uses. Many are able to work from home instead of commuting to work, for example, and meetings, church and otherwise, can be held internationally. But, like some other things, what was a wonderful servant is becoming a questionable master. Them: I don't need to go to church. I worship God at home! Them, worshiping God at home:



The primary reason many Christian leaders have reservations

is because by attending church services on-line we miss something fundamental in the Christian faith. The Bible gives it the name fellowship. Fellowship is a God-ordained practice. Of the five fundamental things to which the first believers devoted themselves after Peter's sermon on the Day of Pentecost, one was fellowship (Acts 2:42). Later, we read the author of Hebrews exhorting his readers to not give up meeting together, as some were in the habit of doing (10:25). Again, he was encouraging fellowship.

The Colson article whimsically quotes a well-known ditty - with a twist: 'Here's the church, and here's the steeple; open the door... but where's the people?'

Where, indeed? Some have found they no longer want or need church but a significant number simply find it much easier to listen on-line. Instead of coming out to church or meeting together in a home group, its more convenient to go to the computer. While this is better than nothing it is not best and, in the long term, it is neither spiritually healthy nor good for the Body. It doesn't enhance the kind of fellowship we need, the kind we find when we come together in person. It is rather like a married couple who have to be away from each other and can only communicate by telephone or Facetime. It is okay for a short while, but to maintain a healthy relationship, they need to come together, to spend time together. Of course, there are people who have to be off-island and there are those few who are shut-ins who are thankful for technology that keeps them in touch. But, for many others, failure to go out to church has become a bad habit.

Our church has some impressive statistics as to the number of views it has had of its services, and for how many are listening live. However, for many this way of worshipping is second best. They need to be worshiping with their brothers and sisters in church. They also need to meet in a small group, enjoying that special fellowship and friendship that comes as a result.

As did the author of Hebrews, I want to encourage those of you who have stayed away from church or home group to return to the habit of attending Sunday worship - sitting in a pew instead of on your couch - and also to become a regular part of a small group, wherever it meets. **Michael Bowerman**


