## **Tom Mason Ordained**

A new journey for **Tom Mason** will start on July 1st as he begins his pastoral ministry in the two-point Pastoral Charge of Elmvale and Knox Flos Presbyterian Churches in Ontario, Canada.

Many at Elmslie and throughout the Council will remember Tom who was a member at Elmslie and South Sound for many years, becoming a lay pastor at the latter before leaving for Canada a year or so back.

Tom was for many years the manager of Comfort Suites, During his early years in Cayman, he recommitted his life to the Lord. He gained a desire to study theology and, during his spare time, did on-line studies through Knox College in Toronto, eventually earning a Master's in Theology in 2018 and one in Divinity in 2020. He was ordained a few months ago and has now been called to serve as a minister.



Tom and his wife, **Terry**, are still missed by people here but we can be assured that our loss will be his new churches' gain.

To make this additionally a special year, he and Terry welcomed their first grandchild, **Mackenzie Rosemary**, early in June, daughter to their son **Kyle** and his wife **Tori**.

### **Council News**

The Cayman Islands Regional Council held a meeting on May 28th. Several matters concerning the United Church in Cayman were discussed. Below are some that might be of special interest to the George Town Charge.

• A Synod remit, presented by **Rose Wedderburn**, DGS of the Southern Region Mission Council, deputizing for the General Secretary, **Rev. Norbert Stephens**, stated concern due to the lack of interest for full-time ministry among the youth and church membership.

• Members nominated Revs. **Astor Carlyle** and **Tara Tyme** to the office of Moderator of Synod. Other councils will also make nominations and the vote for Moderator will take place at September's meeting of Council.

A five-year lease agreement with a new tenant for the former Atlantis property was signed in April.

• Special note was made of the new relationship of Elmslie and Robert Young Memorial Churches. John Macmillan will continue as the lay pastor at Robert Young, now deemed "a mission station", under the supervision of **Rev. Chris Mason**.

• Note was made of the summer camps at the Prospect Youth Centre under the theme "A New Season." This year, these will be day only camps. It was also noted that all charges will be hosting VBS during the summer months.

• To date, \$2600 had been raised in support of Ukraine. This money would be forwarded through the Red Cross.

• Each congregation gave a brief report. With regard to Robert Young, it was stated that there had been a steady increase in numbers but few young people were attending. There were plans to repeat several former extra events during the latter part of the year to increase awareness on the church's presence in the community. *Continued on Page 3*

Roy reported that this conference was very different from the one he attended in 2019 as it not only catered to leaders in the church but also school teachers and leaders from other organisations. There was a lot of introspection at this conference which had him reflecting for the most part, and it also taught Madda and him how better to build relationships with children and teens, understand them more, use the technology in delivering lessons, practical ways to help them understand the Bible and how to walk closer with God.

### **Mission Trip to Tanzania**

Mike Bowerman, along with Bishop PJ Lawrence and Andrew & Debreca Rollins from St. George's Anglican Church, recently returned from a mission trip to Tanzania.

It was a busy ten days in which they ministered in the Anglican Diocese of Ruvuma, the southern region of the country. Mike's primary task was training leaders and preaching, and he conducted 13 seminars on evangelism and witnessing as well as on Christian leadership, and preached four times. Bishop PJ also conducted training sessions and preached while the Rollins sought to look at ways they could help with some of the practical needs of the diocese.

The area in which they ministered is poor and the needs great. Two which Mike has identified and for which he is seeking further support are for Christian literature and for a small, very under-funded hospital run by the church. The ministers have few resources in terms of Christian and theological books and some money was left as 'seed' for a diocesan library. They were also able to help in a small way with some of the expenses of the hospital.
