
From the Pastor's Desk

In our current culture, there is much uncertainty about the future. Fears often trigger other emotions, including despair and anger, and much of it is played out on social media. In truth,

there is much to fear in our lives and in our world. The unknown future can seem dark and filled with danger. We wonder if we can handle it. We wonder how we can endure. From our children's health to paying for school, from job security to who runs the country, from prayers unanswered to relationships under strain, we worry about what could happen and what we will do when it does.

David wrote, "Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war arise against me, yet I will be confident" (Psalm 27:3). Psalm 27 is a song and a prayer of trusting God in the face of fears.

The ultimate fulfillment of this psalm is found in Christ, the one who conquered our worst fears at the cross. He is our light and salvation. Because of Jesus, we can come into God's presence with confidence and hope. As Paul wrote in Romans, "If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did



not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?" (8:31-32). If God sacrificed His own Son to save us from our sins, how would he not also be with us in the fears we face today?

Update on the Emergency Assistance Team (EAT)

Question: Why should we as, followers of Christ, be prayerfully concerned for and actively contribute to help those in our community who are in need?

These passages from God's Word clearly tell us: "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth" (I John 3:16-18 NIV). "Real religion, the kind that passes muster before God the Father, is this: Reach out to the homeless and loveless in their plight, and guard against corruption from the godless world" (James 1:27 The Message).

During the early days of the spread of Covid-19 back in March, a member of Elmslie answered God's call to help those in need and so made a substantial gift to help provide for people in our churches and community including, but not exclusive to, our shut-ins and those who had previously been aided by our Pantry Ministry.

An Emergency Assistance Team was appointed to oversee the obtainment and distribution of food and funds for medicines and the team held its first meeting on April 1st to plan and implement an effective strategy to get supplies to those in need as efficiently as possible. The team consists of Rev. Chris, elders Joan McField, Anthony Bodden and William Walmsley, administrator Janet Macmillan, secretary Cathy Gomez and facilitator Richard Trull.

Update on EAT (Cont'd. from Pg. 1)

Planning included selection of suppliers, determination of a balanced nutritional package, development of a confidential list of recipients, obtainment of the required curfew exemption letters from Government to enable regular deliveries and establishment of financial accounts and reports to the elders to provide proper ongoing accountability for expenses incurred.

The team originally met weekly but currently meets, makes deliveries and submits reports to the board fortnightly. William provides ongoing communication with the board. Joan, Anthony and, when possible, Tony Mc Field and Francilla Myles

undertake bagging and delivery of food and funds for medicines. Janet manages the accounting of finances and the list of recipients, which peaked at 76 individuals and families. By God's grace, some have been able to go back to work so the list has recently declined to 68. Cathy prepares minutes of team meetings.

Recognizing the importance of regular spiritual nourishment as well as physical food, especially during the stressful constraints of lockdown, prayers are offered to recipients during deliveries and special scripture verses are prepared and included along with distributions. These also contain contacts for recipients to reach Rev Chris. for pastoral care and several people have sought assistance in this way.

This is one of the messages we have provided: "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever" (Psalm 73:26 NIV).

Well known minister and writer, Max Lucado once said,: "Meet your fears with faith." If we think back over our lives, there have been many times when we worried about something, but our worry did not change anything. We pray today that your faith will overcome any fears or anxieties that you may have. God bless you!
